- Give a talk about bumblebees – if you like public speaking why not give a talk to a local gardening club, WI or rotary club?

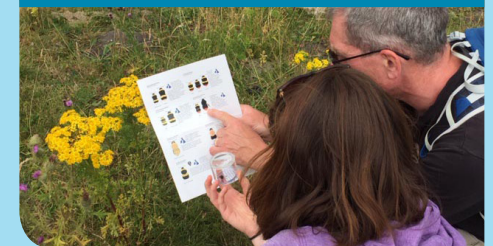


Spread the word
