Bumblebee senses

We've been exploring the world as bumblebees do, using our senses to notice smells, colours, and sounds.

👉 **At home:** Take a “**bumblebee senses walk**” in your garden, local park, or any outdoor area. Encourage your child to smell flowers, listen for buzzing insects, and spot colourful plants. Bonus points if you spot a bumblebee!

Matching colours

Children practiced identifying colours that bumblebees love, such as yellows, purples, and blues. These colours help bumblebees locate different flowers, which contain yummy nectar.

👉 **At home:** Create a colour-matching game. Pick a colourful object, and task your child to collect as many items of the **same colour** as they can. You could do this indoors or outdoors.
